2004 LWW Annual Meeting Stream Quality Program Report

2004 was a BANER YEAR for the LWC Stream Quality Program. Stream monitoring sampled on 46 occasions accomplishing 42 benthic macroinvertebrate and 25 habitat assessments. **Forty-eight different monitors** were involved, and a record **27 stations** were assessed. This includes collaborating with four members of the former North Fork Goose Creek Watershed Committee to assess three of their stations and three new stations they are monitoring.

Other highlights:

- Monitoring sites twice yearly rather than four times seems to be working well. Monitors
 were able to assess 27 sites compared to the 11 sites assessed in 2003. This included several
 new sites in the Catoctin Creek watershed that will help LWC assess progress on restoring
 water quality in this watershed.
- LWC submitted a draft Quality Assurance
 Program Plan (QAPP) as requested by DEQ.
 DEQ is trying to standardize citizen monitoring throughout the state in order to improve the validity of citizen data. LWC is awaiting comments from DEQ before finalizing this document.
- LWC volunteers (Ellie and Phil Daley, Fred Fox, and Chris and Darrell Schwalm) cleaned-up, installed shelves, organized the equipment, and fixed the door of the stream monitoring storage room at the Rust Sanctuary. Fred Fox donated a desk. The storage area LOOKS GREAT!
- LWC and Loudoun Watershed Watch (LWW) received a new stream monitoring grant from DEQ for 2005 in the amount of \$4200. The project managers are Fred Fox and Darrell Schwalm. Most of the grant money will support education and monitoring initiatives related to TMDL implementation in the Catoctin Creek watershed. A second grant of \$6600 was received from Virginia that will allow LWC and LWW to continue these initiatives in 2006.







• LWC (Fred Fox) purchased some new monitoring equipment in 2004 with DEQ grant funds including a turbidity tube to measure suspended sediment in the water column. Additional purchases of chemical and bacteriological equipment is planned so LWC can expand their monitoring parameters at some stations in the Catoctin Creek watershed in 2005.

Stream Monitoring Findings for 2005:

- The stream monitoring data are currently being used to update profiles on each watershed. The first updated profile on the Catoctin Creek watershed is available on the LWW website at www.loudounwatershedwatch.org.
- These data are also being used to develop additional educational brochures about the need for citizen stewardship to protect and restore our stream resources in Loudoun County.
- Stream monitoring results for some key stations are shown in the following tables:









Program Needs for 2005:

- LWC continues to need a Stream Quality Program Coordinator in order to provide better communication, team building, recruitment of monitoring volunteers, and collaboration with the Loudoun Soil and Water Conservation District and Loudoun Environmental Health.
- LWC needs a Bacteria Monitoring Coordinator to lead a new bacteriological, water quality monitoring program in the Catoctin Creek watershed to help assess accomplishments of the Catoctin Creek Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) Implementation Plan adopted by the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR). LWC also needs to recruit and train monitors for this initiative.
- LWC needs to establish additional stream monitoring teams and assign some existing teams additional stations in order to continue monitoring the new stations in Catoctin watershed.
- LWC needs to train additional team leaders to do the habitat assessment. In 2004 one person did about 90% of the assessments.
